Conference Overview

Eight Extraordinary Channels of Classical Chinese Medicine

The eight extraordinary channels run deep within our bodies and supply the 12 main channels with Qi and Blood. They therefore deal with the domain of Yuan Qi and so represent our constitution, our DNA, our genetics. Yuan Qi reflects our ability to procreate, the concept of sexual energy and the idea of maintaining and containing our lineage.

It's about survival, evolution, our ability to adapt, to develop the intrinsic Virtues of what is rooted in human existence and in particular the notion of Humility. These channels represent the physiology of Yuan Qi whose nature is to constantly unfold, to allow for human development, its about growth, maturity and subsequently, the decline of Yuan Qi is about our own decline and coming to terms with out mortality.

These channels represent the link between pre-natal energies to the post-natal manifestation. They synchronize the development of the foetus and later oversee the transformations at all the stages and levels of life. Since these channels conduct Yuan Qi/Jing essence, they serve as the foundation of one's health and are implicated in serious and complicated illnesses.

The extra-ordinary vessels are very effective for a wide variety of physical and mental disorders and often provide a breakthrough in the treatment of chronic and complicated conditions.

The eight extra channels include the (1) Du Mai (2) Ren Mai (3) Chong Mai (P (4) Dai Mai, (5) Yang Qiao Mai, (6) Yin Chao Mai, (7) Yang Wei Mai, and (8) Yin Wei Mai. In the context of acupuncture, the Eight Extras are typically used in pairs: Ren with Yin Qiao Mai, Du with Yang Qiao Mai, Chong with Yin Wei Mai, and Dai with Yang Wei Mai. Of these eight meridians, only the Ren and the Du have their own acupuncture points; the other six utilize points belonging to the twelve main meridians.

From a Qigong perspective the Du, the Ren, the Chong and the Dai are the most important of the Eight Extraordinary Meridians. In the Microcosmic Orbit for example, the Ren and the Du channels are linked into a single continuous circuit.

During this seminar Master Yuen will discuss the role of the Eight Extra Meridians within the channel system in general. The historical development, questions of accessibility, theoretical applications, point selection, needling techniques and conditions treated.

Conference Presenter

About Jeffrey C. Yuen

Jeffrey C. Yuen comes from two Daoist lineages. He is an 88th generation Daoist master of the Yu Qing Huang Lao Pai



(Jade Purity Yellow Emperor Lao Zi School) and a 26th generation Daoist Master of the Quan Zhen Long men Pai (Complete Reality Dragon Gate School). His Daoist

Name for each tradition is respectively Yuan Xu and Song De.

Mr. Yuen trained under his adopted grandfather, the late Daoist Master Yu Wen (1872-1981) of the Yu Qing Huang Lao Pai, a sect from the Shang Qing tradition of Daoism that developed during the later Han Dynasty (3rd Cent. CE). Master Yu Wen trained in Mt. Hua and learned all the facets of Daoism, including the classics; rites and liturgies; healing arts; and divination. He later traveled extensively throughout China and served as the lineage holder of the Daoist martial arts system known as Wu Xing Quan/Five Element Fist - an internal and monastic style of Hua Shan. Having a strong resonance with Daoist teachings ever since childhood,

Jeffrey studied extensively under Master Yu Wen and was allowed to openly practice and serve the community when he was 16 years old.

Mr. Yuen also studied Chinese herbal medicine with Master Gong Song-Liu, a eunuch for the last two emperors of the Qing Dynasty who apprenticed with the imperial medical physicians. As a friend of Master Yu Wen, Gong was persuaded to teach Jeffrey, imparting his deep knowledge of Chinese medicine over a period of 8 years. At the age of 100, Master Gong felt deeply satisfied with his transmission to Jeffrey and returned to China.

Today Jeffrey Yuen is recognized internationally as a master scholar, teacher and practitioner of Classical Chinese Medicine. This includes Acupuncture, Herbal Medicine, Nutrition/Dietetics, the therapeutic use of Stones and Essential Oils, Tai Qi, Qi Gong and Daoism. Indeed, as a Daoist priest, Jeffrey is at the forefront of the restoration of the spiritual roots of Chinese Medicine. His teachings rooted in the spiritual tradition of Daoist mysticism bring a clarity, wisdom and depth to Chinese Medicine rarely found today.
